



# Caretaker

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Job Role:	Caretaker

#### JOB PURPOSE:

The Caretaker is responsible, together with the estates team, for the opening up, closing down, security, general maintenance and upkeep of the Hammond Estate to ensure that the Hammond has the most suitable working environment for its pupils, students and staff and their activities.

#### MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES:

The job holder is part of a small team reporting to, and working closely with, the Facilities Manager. The Caretaker will be responsible for key holding, and securing grounds and buildings, setting up and breaking down areas, security, general maintenance, new works and other varied roles required of the estates management team within a performing arts, academic and boarding environment.

The job includes the following roles and responsibilities: -

- 1 On a rota basis be responsible for opening the grounds and buildings within the Hammond Estate and checking all facilities to ensure that they are safe and suitable for their daily purpose.
- 2 On a rota basis be responsible for closing the Hammond Estate ensuring all buildings and grounds are vacated, secured and alarmed.
- 3 On a rota basis carry out Key Holder duties being on standby for callouts for fire or intruder activations or major incidents (e.g., major water leaks etc). The job holder will endeavour to operate in a manner that will help minimise call outs and the associated need for a member of staff to attend site.
- 4 On a rota basis, attend open days, performances, and events to undertake car parking, traffic management, security and caretaking duties.
- 5 Setting up and breaking down performance, academic and event facilities.
- 6 Identifying any safety or maintenance issues, making safe and reporting to the Facilities Manager.
- 7 Resolving general maintenance issues under the instruction of the Facilities Manager within technical capabilities or by assisting other members of the estates team.
- 8 Communicating with pupils, students, staff, and visitors in a friendly and courteous manner with high levels of customer service and a "can-do" positive attitude.

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- 9 The job holder must ensure that they are fully aware of the Hammond Health & Safety, Safeguarding and other relevant policies and procedures, undertake relevant mandatory training and annual refresher training.
- 10 The role holder will be expected to undertake training on a genie mobile access platform for use in the theatre and ensure that safety regulations are always followed when using this.
- 11 Dependent on technical maintenance experience, the post holder will be expected to develop their skill basis over time to enable them to make good and repair minor defects and contribute to minor new works which occur within the Hammond environment. Training and mentoring will be given to develop this if required.
- 12 The role holder will be expected to carry out any other reasonable duties associated with this role and that of the estates team.

## **STANDARDS:**

- To supp
- ort the senior management in implementing the ethos and wider philosophies of the • Hammond.
- To ensure health and safety procedures and safeguards are always observed.
- To attend team, INSET and staff meetings, open days, carol concerts and other events when required.
- To promote goodwill and foster good relationships with parents, members of staff and visitors to ensure the smooth running of day-to-day activities.
- To set a good example in terms of punctuality, dress code and attendance.
- To work flexibly on a rota system with other members of the estates team.

### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Possess previous experience in a caretaking or maintenance role is desirable, but not essential.
- Be proficient in basic electrical, plumbing, carpentry, painting, or decorating work.
- Have a good grasp of Maths and English.
- Have a qualifications in maintenance/building/caretaking or similar would be an advantage.
- Experience of working with children or young people (paid or voluntary), for referencing purposes would be an advantage.
- Can demonstrate knowledge of specific technical, health and safety, and security issues in schools.
- A patient approach towards working with children and adults alike.

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- Effective communication skills, both orally and in writing, and able to work to deadlines.
- A strong work ethic, the ability to work flexibly as part of a team of technicians, and a • professional attitude.
- Can take initiative and work independently..
